

Ben spoke warmly about the beginning of a journey for this year's lucky scholarship recipients. He described a foray into baked goods, *Weihnachtsmärkte*, snow, Deutsche Bahn, more baked goods, German efficiency and most importantly, an immersion in the German language. He then invited SAGSE President Egon Vetter to the podium to give his welcoming address.

In opening, Egon asked whether there was still a role for an organisation such as SAGSE in a significantly changing world. "The answer," he confirmed, "is quite simply, yes". While the organisation has seen some changes since its inception in 1967, its vision has remained consistent – to make the world a better place.



The SAGSE scholarship program is unique because it is more than a school excursion. It is an extended learning experience, which *challenges* students to adapt to a new language, school and culture. Students are also given the opportunity to travel unaccompanied within Germany for five days, an invaluable lesson in independence and responsibility. Upon their return, students are more mature, self-confident and open-minded, ready for their next trip to Germany. Already, some intend to return for work or further study at university, as many have done in the past.

These opportunities make possible the ongoing personal and professional development of our scholarship recipients, past and present. "Tonight," Egon said, "We launch 14 new exceptional careers".

This reinforces the main reason for SAGSE's success: the organisation's focus on the developing its students, and its vision of providing opportunities without commercial gain. For this reason, it has awarded over 500 scholarships to students in Victoria. It seeks to give talented students the opportunity to flourish, regardless of background. Such is only made possible through the ongoing commitment of its volunteers, friends and sponsors.

It was formed in 1974 by a group of senior Australian business people who recognised the growing economic significance of the Federal Republic of Germany to Australia. In particular, they noticed its importance in the areas of trade and investment.

By operating on an informal basis, the AGA has become a vehicle through which these objectives can be achieved, and this applies equally to German business people keen to learn something more about their Australian counterparts.

Since its formation, the AGA has been active in providing a suitable forum for visitors from either country to meet with nationals of the host country, often over a dinner or luncheon. The AGA has played host to a large number of visitors from Germany, occupying positions of responsibility and influence in areas of government, industry, commerce, banking, trade unions and culture.
